Visit of the All Party Delegation, led by H.E. Shri Sanjay Kumar Jha, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, India to Singapore (27 May 2025)

All-Party Parliamentary Delegation led by Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Shri Sanjay Kumar Jha visited Singapore on 27 May 2025. Their visit to Singapore was as part of the Government of India's outreach with countries in the region to convey the significance of Operation Sindoor and the new normal in India's strategy against terrorism.

During the visit, the delegation met Mr Edwin Tong, Minister for Law and Second Minister for Home Affairs, Ms Sim Ann, Senior Minister of State for Foreign Affairs and Home Affairs and Dr Janil Puthucheary, Senior Minister of State for Education, Sustainability and the Environment. The delegation engaged with Singaporean Members of Parliament, senior business and community leaders, representatives of think-tanks, academia, media and Indian diaspora. 4. During the interactions with Singaporean interlocutors, the delegation conveyed India's stance on the events since the terror attack in Pahalgam, Operation Sindoor and new normal in India's strategy against terrorism. They briefed about the new benchmark in India's fight against terrorism; India will give a fitting reply if there is a terrorist attack on India, India will not tolerate any nuclear blackmail and India will not differentiate between the government sponsoring terrorism and the masterminds of terrorism. The delegation requested for continued support from Singapore in the fight against terrorism.

5. The delegation visited Singapore after visiting Japan and Republic of Korea. From Singapore, the delegation is traveling to Indonesia and Malaysia.
